Key Details:

- The Fellowship will be undertaken at the research facility of those ARTICULUM members who have previously agreed to host a Fellow.
- Funding will be in an appropriate amount to provide salary support for Fellows to undertake a 6-12 month research project.
- The applications will be evaluated by an ARTICULUM Committee, who will make the final decision as to which centre the chosen Fellows will be assigned to.

- Be no more than 40 years of age
- Have an MD degree
- Be enrolled in a postgraduate training programme with at least 1 year of specialty training in rheumatology, musculoskeletal medicine, orthopaedic surgery or acute/chronic pain management
- Demonstrate a strong career interest in arthritis and pain
- Plan to devote 100% of professional time to research
- Be available to undertake the Fellowship in 2016/2017
